MARINElife's core work since 1995 has been researching the distribution, abundance and population trends for seabird, whales, dolphins, seabirds, and other marine wildlife from vessels of opportunity. MARINElife currently operate year-round surveys on a network of routes from UK ports, as well as surveys on small boats and dedicated research vessels. The data is used widely in research and in marine biodiversity policy, designation, and management. JNCC is the public body that advises the UK Government and devolved administrations on UK-wide and international nature conservation.

Recently MARINElife joined forces with JNCC, to develop a volunteer seabirds at-sea monitoring programme in England (VSAS England). This involves running volunteer surveyor and mentor training courses in European Seabirds at Sea (ESAS) survey methods; and co-ordinating a series of monthly surveys on selected MARINElife ferry routes.

With the support of JNCC, MARINElife is now advertising for a part-time member of the surveys team, to undertake a variety of organisational and administrative tasks to coordinate the VSAS England programme. This role is responsible for recruiting volunteers, organising training courses and ensuring that surveyors have all the materials and route specific information they require to conduct their surveys and complete data entry and any feedback required.

Organising VSAS training courses in partnership with JNCC

Co-ordinating VSAS surveys

Maintaining and developing survey pack materials.

Maintaining a close relationship with ferry company contacts to schedule survey dates and bookings.

Planning promotion and recruitment of survey teams, liaising with volunteers to allocate balanced teams to survey dates.

Ensuring surveyors are supplied with and using up to date materials i.e. protocols, record forms, tablets.

Updating and maintaining the VSAS England Seabird surveyor database

Distribution and processing of volunteer agreements.

Processing surveyor training and development appraisals as required.

Reviewing current and any new volunteer training and survey materials

Data management and reporting

Liaising with volunteers to update and maintain volunteer records.

Liaising with survey teams to ensure timely submission of survey data and feedback report.

Liaising with JNCC regarding digitised data submission

Reporting to Trustees as required

Developing routes for VSAS surveys

Develop new ferry routes where VSAS surveys can be carried out on a regular basis, as volunteer surveyor pool increases
